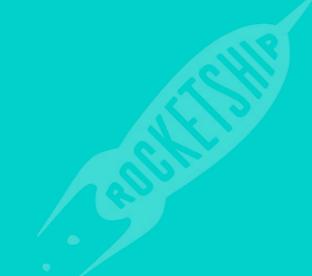




First Day of School Highlights





Changes from Q3 Forecast

Projected CINA at the region increased by about \$6mm on the basis of total expenses running about \$6.5mm under budget and a small decrease in revenue.

While some final values are likely to change in audit, we know that the region as a whole exceeded its CINA target and is well clear of debt covenants.

One school, RMS, finished with a negative CINA.

Budget Revisions since June

Following initial approval, regional and national teams have worked closely to stress test and update our budgets for the year taking into account newly available information:

- State funding formula changes
- Updated spending plans for restricted grants resulting in more accurate revenue estimates
- Expense updates, including benefits actuals, revised staffing plans, and contractual cost changes.

In addition, we have been closely monitoring enrollment progress to manage revenue targets:

• CA has reduced its target by 1.5%.

Changes from June Version

Funding formula changes have resulted in slightly less federal revenue

Revised grant plans have resulted in more <u>restricted</u> state revenue, offsetting decrease in <u>unrestricted</u> state revenue from enrollment drop.

Personnel expense increase is due to new restricted grant spending, other categories essentially flat.


Bottom line - all campuses are still projected CINA-positive and the regional projected CINA is slightly higher than projected in June.



Response to CA Dashboard

Chronic Absenteeism:

- Implemented attendance meetings in collaboration with CareCorps Coordinator, Principal, Office Manager, and families approaching 18 total absences
- CareCorps Coordinator primary responsibility is to build relationships with families who are chronically absent and work on systems to increase their attendance

Suspensions:

- After COVID every campus has a wellness teacher or counselor to provide social-emotional support
- Regular professional development amongst staff to support restorative justice practices
- Effective Tier 2 interventions like check-in, check-out and social skills groups

Academic Indicators (Math, ELA, ELPI)


- Transition to new Math curriculum (Eureka) and lower literacy curriculum (CKLA) in 23-24
- Tiered approach to academic support
 - RSA and RSSP will receive additional tutoring through Step Up Math and BATA
 - o RDL will receive virtual tutoring through Ignite and piloting Tier 1 instructional shifts for grade levels with more than 50% below 33rd percentile
- Invested in increased multilingual talent (1 manager to 2 managers) to provide more on-campus designated ELD support




