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ELEMENTARY-ONLY BY DESIGN



Improving the Public Education Ecosystem

By focusing exclusively on elementary education, we work to improve the entire ecosystem of public education in the communities we serve.

We are not creating a parallel K-12 school system, we are focused on improving outcomes for kids and deepening engagement with parents at the elementary level.

Our expertise in elementary education prepares thousands of Rocketeers in their vital early years of education. When our graduates move on to attend different middle schools, those students are ready for the rigors of middle school. In fact, a three-year study by SRI Education found that our Rocketeers across the country are a full year ahead of their middle school classmates in both math and reading. This means middle schools are enrolling more students that are on grade level and ready to advance their education.

We're also sending Rocketeers off to middle schools and ensuring a smooth transition by partnering with our parents throughout the year and offering our Prepared for Liftoff Middle School Support program. Through this unique combination, parents become champions of their child's learning and learn how to harness the power of their voice to advocate for their children and their communities. Families also participate in middle school fairs and get connected to schools with high success rates. They also learn to hold leaders accountable, in the local school district or charters, and ensure their kids continue to receive the same excellence in education that they experienced during their elementary years at Rocketship.

Excellent elementary schools beget stronger middle schools beget stronger high schools. It's a virtuous cycle designed to scale impact far beyond the number of seats offered by Rocketship. This is how our elementary-only model is designed to elevate the entire public education ecosystem in the communities we serve.

EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

In 2016, Rocketship Rise Academy opened in Southeast DC's Ward 8 as the largest charter opening in DC history. Rocketship Legacy Prep opened in Ward 7 a year later. In their very first year, both schools achieved Tier 1 status—the highest ranking for DC Public Charter Schools. In August 2020, in the midst of the pandemic, Rocketship Infinity Community Prep opened its doors as our third school in DC. Partnering with AppleTree Institute to provide high-quality pre-K education, we serve more than 1,000 Rocketeers every day—students who have the potential to be DC's next leaders and creative thinkers.

Looking Ahead:

Doubling the Percentage of College-Ready Rocketeers

Every year is a chance for students to thrive and reach their full potential, and at Rocketship, we're dedicated to ensuring that all our students are on the path to success. To support this mission, we offer individualized learning plans and review student-level data to adjust content and pace to meet each student's learning abilities. While we recognize that closing academic gaps won't happen overnight, we are committed to fostering significant growth that will help our students be confidently college-ready.

NWEA MAP is a nationally normed assessment that's predictive of entrance to and graduation from college. The national average for college entry and graduation for all students, irrespective of race, is roughly 40%, and adjusts to 28% for Black and 25% for Hispanic students. At Rocketship, 98% of students identify as students of color, which means our goal is to far outpace national averages based on who we serve. In the 2023-24 school year, 20% of Rocketship DC students performed in the top tier of the NWEA MAP test, giving us a benchmark to build from.

We seek to surpass the national averages of college readiness for Black and Hispanic students by 2028, ensuring 40% of our Rocketeers perform in the top tier in core subjects.

We know every year we'll get closer to this ambitious goal. Our Rocketship Legacy Prep Kindergartners proved just that by starting their academic journey. Based on the latest NWEA MAP results, Kindergarten Rocketeers at Legacy Prep averaged more than 1.4 years of growth in both math and reading! And all of our students increased their literacy skills by improving their English Language Arts proficiency rates by 15 points from the beginning to the end of the school year.

We're proud of the hard work our educators and Rocketeers put in every day and look forward to our collective growth ahead!




Rocketship Washington DC Educators Reflect the Communities We Serve

An increasing body of research shows that student achievement and attendance go up and suspension rates go down when students have at least one same-race teacher. Yet America's teaching force has not increased in community representation over the years with only 20% of public school teachers in the U.S. who are people of color. According to the National Center for Education Statistics, there has been a slight increase in Latino public school teachers since 2015 and the share of Black teachers has declined since the 1990s.

We are flipping the script at Rocketship. Our educators reflect the communities we serve. The majority of our educators—97%—identify as people of color.

Equity and excellence in education are about providing each student with what they need to succeed. This includes learning from teachers who offer both windows and mirrors—people who bring new perspectives, as well as reflect their own background and experience. That is why Rocketship is working relentlessly to ensure that our Rocketeers are taught by a representative team of educators who bring experiences, ideas, and perspectives to our classrooms that even more deeply connect with our kids and communities.



Bringing Healthy Living into the School Community

We believe the right community partnerships help broaden opportunities for our Rocketeers. That's why Rocketship Washington DC and Out Teach, an outdoor education science lab, are bringing learning to life across all three Rocketship schools.

Out Teach helps schools across the country transform the outdoors into active learning labs that:

- Unlock the wonder of science for students through hands-on learning
- Teaches urban gardening practices that can help reduce food scarcity
- Inspire healthy living and boost overall well-being through time in nature
- Encourage teachers to use these blooming outdoor spaces as learning spaces throughout the day

Out Teach's program is designed by educators with real classroom experience, and delivers personalized hands-on training, collaborative partnerships, and easily accessible resources that help our Rocketship teachers recast everyday outdoor spaces into exciting labs where anything is possible. Through this partnership, we're creating a future where every student – regardless of background, resources, or learning differences – can experience the wonder of science first-hand. As part of Out Teach's model, teachers are trained on how to lead instruction in these outdoor spaces, creating a sustainable, ongoing program for the future.



Keeping Rocketeers Safe During At-Risk Hours

Safeguarding our Rocketeers is a top priority at Rocketship DC. Students not only need a space to learn and grow during school, but also deserve a support system they can rely on after school during at-risk hours. But we're not alone in that vision. Washington DC's Mayor Bowser and DC's Deputy of Education Department feel the same and awarded Rocketship DC a three-year grant to revitalize our afterschool programming at Rocketship Rise Academy! This award expands access to our high-quality afterschool program at Rocketship Rise in Ward 8 and serves as a pilot program for what we hope to extend to all of Rocketship DC schools.

Our new extended learning program at Rise brings Rocketeers:

- Daily High-Impact Tutoring (HIT) in both reading and math in partnership with Northstar Tutoring. High-dosage tutoring uses academic data from the school day to help students grow specific skills over a specific time frame. Each Rocketeer is grouped with 3 to 4 other students during this daily, 1-hour tutoring time.
- Visual and theatrical arts, which provides enrichment, social-emotional development, art therapy, and co-curricular field trips for participating Rocketeers in partnership with Creative Youth Development (CYD) and Project Create
- Recreational and sports programs to let kids be kids while also building key leadership tenants
- Summer Academy, where from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Rocketeers can continue receiving all of the above during July and August while also going on more summer-specific field trips in the community

Launching Strong into Middle School

The transition to middle school can be tough. We know Rocketship DC provides a solid foundation for our Rocketeers, but students need an increased level of support beyond 5th grade to thrive from middle school to college. To ensure a seamless transition post-graduation, Rocketship DC offers Prepared for Liftoff. This middle school support program helps 5th-grade Rocketeers choose a quality middle school and helps them navigate the academic, social, and emotional challenges they may experience once they're there.

We're always looking for new, innovative ways to strengthen DC's pipeline from Pre-K to high school and beyond. Prepared for Liftoff is a conduit for this.

SUPPORTING ALUMNI BEYOND ROCKETSHIP

After our students graduate from 5th grade, Rocketship's Prepared for Liftoff team will set alumni up for success. We'll help students maintain strong work habits, feel supported, and forever be a part of the Rocketship community as they make it to and through 9th grade.

PREPARED FOR LIFTOFF ALSO:

- Creates opportunities for Rocketeers at the same school to support each other
- Evaluates their attendance and grades
- Offers family workshops on both academic and social matters
- Equips students with information on middle schools, high school, and college options
- Creates opportunities to visit middle, high schools, and colleges
- Supports our Rocketeer alumni and helps strengthen the DC education ecosystem

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


Rocketship Washington DC Financials
